Direct Services

Children's Ministries Aid/Event Helper: Those working in Children's Ministries or experience with children events will assist in special community events hosted by Lower Lights Ministries. This may involve working one-on-one with children with special needs, organizing groups of children during events, planning and/or facilitating activities, and taking appropriate discipline measures when necessary. Our main goal in this ministry is to show the love of Christ to the children in our community while maintaining safety. The event volunteer will work with the children at special events such as summer Vacation Bible School, and Sunday School, assisting teachers or helping out with the activities.

Food/Personal Care Pantry Coordinator: The Food/Personal Care Pantry Coordinator is a key component to the effective management of food pantry collections, quality control, and service provision to Franklinton residents in emergency need of food items. This management volunteer position requires an individual with basic leadership and management skills, innovation to continue and develop food pantry services.

Project AIM Mentor: Project AIM is a unique and meaningful volunteer based program designed to help participant families break the cycle of poverty. Teams of 2-5 trained volunteers are matched to the families to serve as mentors, role models, and support systems. Minimum time commitment. Each program will last approximately 4-8 months depending on families and mentor.

Rachel's House Community Support Team Coordinator: The CS Team Coordinator selects teams of 3-4 people, appointing one as the leader, for each new resident to act as a support team for the resident's phase development. Coordinator provides training for new members, ensures that meetings are efficient, and collects reports from Teams.

Rachel's House Community Support Team Member: Members of a CS Team meet with a resident of Rachel's House to move her through the 4 phases of the program. They meet her initially to help establish goals, and then meet with her again periodically to evaluate progress and help her with reaching her goals. Their purpose is accountability, assessment, encouragement and motivation.

Rachel's House Finance Coordinator: The Financial Coordinator oversees the budgeting and finance of all residents, and provides financial coaching with means to assist residents of Rachel's House in financial growth. Keeps records of residents' income, program fees, and other expenses and teaches responsible stewardship and prioritizing.

Rachel's House Personal Mentor: A personal mentor interacts with a resident as a Christian accountability partner to provide spiritual guidance and advice on Christian living. This position requires a woman who is a devout, stable follower of Christ who is eager to pursue, and help others pursue a life of holiness.

Administration

Newsletter Editor: The Lower Lights Ministries newsletter serves as the primary communication tool for donors, volunteers, and clients for current news of the organization. The newsletter editor monitors the newsletter to ensure content is accurate and appropriately reflects the mission and values of Lower Lights Ministries.

Office Receptionist: The office receptionist serves as the entry point for new volunteers, donors, staff and clients of Lower Lights Ministries and must be a person who exemplifies the heart of the organization by displaying high levels of hospitality and respect to all who contact this ministry.

Resource Developer: Gather needed items for upcoming Lower Lights Ministries community outreaches and events by asking for donations. Keep track of donors, contributions, and the giving resources. This volunteer will work closely with our Project Coordinator.

Website Developer: The Lower Lights Ministries website serves as an entry point for donors, volunteers, and clients to view the services and current news of the organization. As needs continue to change and increase, the website developer will transform the web layout to increase the functionality of the website, as well as creating a design that is contemporary and relevant to our mission.

Maintenance

Home Maintenance Volunteer: A home maintenance volunteer is a person who has a skill or trade to offer to help with the upkeep of our various properties. A variety of skills are needed to make necessary repairs and additions to the houses. These volunteers are crucial for the ministry (ministries such as Rachel's House) from the cost of professional business services.

Work and Witness Hospitality Director: Take care of arranging the basic needs, such as housing, food and transportation, for Work and Witness teams coming to help LLM. Be available during their stay for crisis management. Assist the director in giving team initial run-down of rules, expectations and housing situations.
